In the Office of the Clerk of Harrison County Court in session Tuesday April 22 1881. Elias Norman this day presented to the clerk of said County Court in his office a paper writing purporting to be the last will and testament of W.D. Norman (who at the time of his death had a known place of residence in the County of Harrison wherein he died) and offered it for Probate. Thereupon came over the following Deacons Rufus J. Wickman, and John D. Blair Three Competent witnesses, after being by me duly sworn depose and swear that they were all well acquainted with the hand writing of the said W.D. Norman, in his lifetime, and from their acquaintance with said hand writing, they were all well satisfied that the said writing is wholly in the hand writing of the said W.D. Norman and that they were <sup>Deceased</sup> the same was written and signed by the said W.D. Norman as and for his will - the hand writing of the said W.D. Norman being fully proven, the said paper writing is admitted to Probate and ordered to be recorded, as and for the last will and testament of the said W.D. Norman does with the following alterations "first I give to my wife 1000 Dollars" "5 year Emily Hanford 1000 Dollars" "7 Albert Hanford 50 Dollars" Stricken out and the words "Margaret Matthew 1000 Dollars" is in this will" written on the margin and the words "and pay it off" interlined
